

2021 GUEST ASSISTANCE GUIDE

Welcome to Kings Island!

We are glad you're here. At Kings Island we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our guests with a safe environment and want our guests to have a safe and enjoyable day. We are continually striving to improve our facilities. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at Guest Services.

Many amusement park rides incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the ride. Guests of larger or smaller size, guests who have a history of heart, back or neck trouble, pregnant guests, people who have had recent surgery, people with casts, braces, restrictive devices or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

Kings Island's Ride Admission Policy has been developed in consultation with industry experts, based on the recommendations of the manufacturer, our past experience and our evaluation of each ride using our knowledge of the ride in both normal and emergency operating conditions. Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of a ride without risk of injury to that person or other riders.

Any guest who feels he or she may be affected by this policy is encouraged to visit Guest Services to obtain a list of the rides he or she can safely ride. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our ride operators to help accommodate you.

RIDE RATING SYSTEM

A Ride Rating System has been designed to provide a scale for rating the thrill factor of each ride. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

Each ride/attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY		DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides	1	Rides that are generally calm and gentle in nature.
Mild Thrill Rides	2	Rides that generally have low speeds with gentle motion and braking. Rides have smooth transitions with some changes in elevation and speed.
Moderate Thrill Rides	3	Rides that generally have low to medium speeds and/or heights with moderate motion and braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in direction and/or speed during portions of the ride.
High Thrill Rides	4	Rides that generally have medium to high speeds and/or heights with moderate to rapid braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in speed, direction and/or elevation.
Aggressive Thrill Rides	5	Rides that generally have one or more of the following: high speeds and/or heights, aggressive and unexpected forces, and rapid directional or elevation change. Riders will encounter many unexpected rapid changes in speed, direction and/or elevation.

PLEASE RIDE SAFELY

Under the Ohio Revised Code Section 993.08 riders must obey all warnings and directions regarding amusement park rides and behave in a manner that will not cause or contribute to injury to themselves or others. Failure to comply is a misdemeanor.

This includes people who are behaving in an unruly fashion or giving the indication of being under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants.

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to a ride to anyone we feel may not be able to safely experience the ride or may be a hazard to other riders.

A Rider Safety Guide sign is posted at every ride entrance and alternate access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the ride. Please review these signs prior to accessing the ride and ensure to follow all instructions provided.

In general, all riders should be in good health and free from any conditions, known or unknown, that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Kings Island. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **DO NOT RIDE.**

Generally, guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in the seat and support their head and neck during the ride movements. Riders using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a rider, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **FOR YOUR SAFETY, DO NOT ENTER UNAUTHORIZED AREAS TO RETRIEVE LOST ARTICLES.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each ride. In general:

- Face forward and remain seated in an upright position with your back and shoulders against the seat back and hold on until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals and other loose items are not permitted on most rides. Glasses must be secured. Smaller items may be secured in cargo pockets, waist packs (as long as they do not interfere with the restraint system), left in a locker, or with a non-rider. Kings Island is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- All passenger restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses and seatbelts, must be positioned, fastened and tightened at all times.
- No picture taking, cell phone or electronic usage while riding.
- Keep all parts of your body inside ride unit at all times.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is only permitted in designated smoking areas.
- Shirt, shoes, and shorts/pants are required on most amusement park rides.

ALTERNATE ACCESS ENTRANCES & ATTRACTION BOARDING PASSES

Kings Island's Ride Admission Policy and Alternate Access Entrances are designed to help you safely experience our facilities and provide equal access to all guests.

The safety of guests and associates is our #1 priority at Kings Island. Safety is a shared partnership between the park and our guests. Not everyone can safely enjoy every ride. Guests are asked to review and carefully consider the ride restrictions using good judgment. However, we reserve the right to make the final decision regarding the eligibility of a rider based on a person's size, weight, willingness to ride, or other limitations. Please refer to your individual Rider Access Form for rides that will safely accommodate you.

If you require the use of an Alternate Access Entrance, please visit Guest Services to obtain a Rider Access Form, Boarding Pass, and Guest Assistance Guide. The Guest Assistance Guide explains the ride entry guidelines and procedures while providing specific information related to each attraction. Alternate Access Entrances are intended to accommodate guests with mobility restrictions or Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and not to bypass others waiting in line. This service is available for a guest with restricted mobility or ASD and up to three companions.

To provide equal access for all guests, we have developed a Boarding Pass Program which allows guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairments to access attractions at specified times via the Alternate Access Entrance (usually the ride's exit or Fast Lane entrance) in order to avoid crowds and waiting in the regular lines. Guests who are in possession of a Boarding Pass will be immediately entitled to arrive at the eligible ride of their choice any time after receipt of the Boarding Pass. When the guest arrives at the Alternate Access Entrance of the ride, the guest will receive the next ride time (an actual time) based on the wait time of the attraction on which the guest has selected to participate first. The guest will be welcomed to participate, and then will be required to wait until the time indicated on the Boarding Pass before being permitted to participate on the next attraction of choice. When that time arrives, the guest should use the Alternate Access Entrance and show the pass to the ride associate, who will assist the guest and their group with participating as well as issuing their next time based on that attraction's wait time. The process will continue throughout the day. Guests may then choose to rest comfortably away from the queue area until their boarding time.

Information on where guests access the ride is posted on each Ride's Rider Safety Sign. All guests, regardless of point of access, are required to meet all riding requirements for the ride, including height and medical restrictions in order to ride/participate.

Here's How It Works

- The guest with a mobility impairment or cognitive impairments should visit Guest Services upon their arrival at the park to express their inability to wait in the regular line. Some questions are asked to ensure that the rider has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience rides, and a Boarding Pass is issued for the guest in question and up to 3 riding companions.
- In addition to a Boarding Pass, the guest with a mobility impairment or cognitive impairments will receive a "Rider Access Form" that lists the rides that the guest with a disability can safely enjoy.

- The guest may proceed to the eligible ride of their choice after receipt of the Boarding Pass.
- When the guest arrives at the Alternate Access Entrance of the ride, the associate will issue the guest's next ride time (an actual time) based on the wait time of the ride the guest has selected first. The guest will be welcomed to ride, and then will be required to wait until the time indicated on the Boarding Pass before being permitted to participate on the next ride of choice. When that time arrives, the guest should use the Alternate Access Entrance and show the pass to the associate, who will assist the guest and their group with participating as well as issuing their next time based on that ride's wait time. The process will continue throughout the day.
- The guest listed on the Boarding Pass must be present as a rider when a Boarding Pass is being utilized.
- Guests may not accumulate more than one boarding time at a time.
- Due to the nature of the attractions in Soak City, Alternate Access and Boarding Passes are only available at Splash River via Entrance.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION & SERVICES

Our goal is to make Kings Island as enjoyable and barrier free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



Assistive Listening Devices

Assistive listening systems utilize a lightweight wireless device that receives a signal from transmitters at certain locations in order to amplify sound. These are recommended for guests with mild to moderate hearing loss. This system is located in the following Live Entertainment venues: Kings Island Theater, International Showplace, Festhaus, and the PEANUTS™ Playhouse. Please ask one of our house ushers to assist in obtaining a device.



Braille & Large Print Guides

Braille and large print guides of the Park Map and Guest Assistance Guide are available at Guest Services. There are a limited number of guides available for daily use on a first-come, first-served basis. Guides must be returned to Guest Services when leaving the park.



First Aid

Our First Aid Building located in Planet Snoopy™ (adjacent to Charlie Brown's Wind Up) is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for guests with medication is offered at First Aid. In addition, a First Aid Building is located near the Train Station in Soak City. This location is open during Soak City operating hours.



Interpretive Services

American Sign Language Interpreting If requested at least one week in advance, Kings Island will provide American Sign Language Interpretation at the following venues: Kings Island Theater, PEANUTS™ Playhouse, Festhaus, International Bandstand, and the International Showplace. To arrange for sign language interpreting services, please call 513-754-5700. Live Show scripts or Score sheets are available at each show venue (with the exception of Kings Island Theater) upon request and must be returned at the end of the show.



Parking for Guests with Disabilities

Parking for guests with disabilities is provided in the parking lot near the front gate. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification.



Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for guest needing the assistance of another guest are available at all restroom locations throughout the park, including First Aid. Wheelchair accessible stalls are located at all restrooms.



Service Animals

Service animals are welcome at Kings Island. A service animal is defined as a dog or miniature pony that has been individually trained to perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Service animals must be controlled with a restraining device and must display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. There is a limit of one service animal per guest. Relief areas are located near Backlot Stunt Coaster and in Soak City by the restrooms near Tropical Plunge.

Due to the nature of most rides, service animals must remain with a non-riding member of your party. We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals may be taken on Boo Blasters on Boo Hill, Eiffel Tower, Kings Island and Miami Valley Railroad, Grand Carousel, and Character Carousel. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools or lazy rivers. Guests may take advantage of our Parent Swap policy for staying with the service animal. Visit Guest Services for more information.



Special Dietary Needs

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small, soft sided coolers to accommodate such needs. Coolers may only be brought into the park by visiting Guest Services upon arrival.



Wheelchair, Stroller and ECV Rental

A limited supply of wheelchairs, electric convenience vehicles (ECV), and strollers are available for rent at the Rental Center on the left, just inside the front gate. Online reservations are available for wheelchair/EVC rentals in advance of your visit. Reservations can be made by going to www.visitkingsisland.com and visit the rentals page under the Tickets tab. Rentals are also available at the park while supplies last. For those guests who choose to use a battery-powered vehicle or wheelchair, we require a safe speed be maintained while traveling in the park.

Wheelchairs, ECV's, and strollers may not be taken out of the park gates or to the parking lot. However, a park associate will be happy to provide any assistance you may need at that time. For any guest using a Segway, please stop by Guest Services prior to entering the park.

DEFINITIONS

Every ride entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the ride. Kings Island uses the following terms:



Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



Hand-held Infant: Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a supervising companion: Boo Blasters on Boo Hill, Eiffel Tower, Grand Carousel (seated on a bench), KI & Miami Valley Railroad, Character Carousel (seated on a bench), Splash River, Coconut Cove, Lookout Lagoon, Castaway Cove. Participation or water depth may be restricted at Breakers Bay and Tidal Wave Bay. Hand-held infants and their supervising companion may also enjoy Splash Landing, but may not participate on the elevated sections of the attraction.



Supervising Companion: Many of our rides have height requirements that allow a guest under that requirement to ride with a supervising companion. A supervising companion is someone who meets all the requirements to ride the ride themselves, is 14 years of age or older, and demonstrates appropriate observed behavior. Supervising companions are responsible for ensuring that the guest remains seated properly – where applicable – and follows all rules and regulations. The supervising companion must be seated in the same seat (row) as the guest who needs accompaniment and can accompany the number of riders for which the seat is designed. For example, if a seat is designed for three people, the supervising companion can accompany two riders.

EVACUATIONS

Evacuations may be required due to such causes as a mechanical problem, weather conditions, or power interruption. If an evacuation is required, guests may need to maneuver across catwalks, from the highest point of the ride, and down steeply inclined catwalks or steps. Ride units may also stop at the top of lifts or on the ride course due to mechanical reasons. Certain evacuations may require guests to use additional safety equipment during the process. Remain seated until given instructions.

In Soak City, guests may be asked to evacuate pools as quickly as possible using stairs or ladders.

If evacuation from a ride/attraction is required, for safety reasons, we may evacuate ambulatory guests prior to evacuating those guests using wheelchairs. If so, you accept any danger due to delayed evacuation or if we need to physically lift or lower you. If you use your wheelchair on a ride, you are responsible for it being able to withstand the movement of the ride.

GUESTS OF LARGER SIZE

All passenger restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts must be positioned and fastened properly to allow guests to ride.

Due to rider restraint system requirements, guest of larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or body proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our rides.

Our larger guests may experience difficulty on: Banshee, Diamondback, Drop Tower, Flight of Fear & Orion.

Maximum weight limits can be found under the individual rides in this guide and on the Rider Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to rides with restrictions.

If you are concerned whether or not you can be accommodated safely on a ride, you may enter the ride via the exit to ensure the restraints function properly prior to waiting in line. The rest of your party may wait for you outside the exit. Tests seats are located at the ride entrance of: Banshee, Diamondback and Delirium.

The manufacturer requires a maximum rider height on the following rides: 76" (Delirium), 78" (Flying Ace, Banshee, Invertigo) and 80" (Drop Tower).

GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS

On most rides where guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on or near the ride platform or walkway near the ride. Almost every ride is wheelchair accessible.

Wheelchair lifts are available at Banshee, Mystic Timbers and Orion to transport a guest in a wheelchair and one companion to our 2nd story ride platforms. Please use the doorbell/phone at base of lift to request service. Please ask an associate at each location for assistance. Wheelchairs and ECV's cannot be accommodated on most rides and attractions, with the exception of Eiffel Tower and Kings Island and Miami Valley Railroad. Please refer to the individual ride and attraction descriptions in the back of this brochure for more specific information.

If in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Guest Services. Kings Island personnel are not trained in transferring guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

Guests may re-charge their wheelchair battery at the outlet outside of Guest Services or the Rental Center located by the front gate.

HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against 5 primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride or would like more rider information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Assistance Guide or review the Safety Guides and all warning signs posted at each ride entrance and alternate access entrance.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific rider instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. Children may be "officially" measured at one of the height measurement stations located at Help Center (just inside the front gate) and in Planet Snoopy™ near Snoopy™ vs. Red Baron. The measured guest will be given a wristband to indicate their height range. Wristbands are not required to ride. They are intended to make your wait in line shorter by streamlining the rider height measurement process.

For the safety of the child, a standard play shoe that does not contribute excessively to the child's height is required. For example, a child is not permitted to wear platform shoes to help meet the height requirement. Kings Island reserves the right to ask that shoes be removed to ensure that a child's height is not being artificially enhanced or manipulated.

Height measurements for Soak City slides and attractions are taken in bare feet.

LOOSE ARTICLES

Most rides cannot accommodate loose articles including cell phones, hats, cameras, purses, backpacks, basketballs, umbrellas, beverage containers, electronic devices, etc. Items must be safely secured in cargo pockets, a waist pack, in a bin on the ride platform, in a locker, or with a non-rider. Kings Island is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

Extra or bulky clothing, backpacks, and anything else that could potentially be between the rider and the restraint will not be allowed. The restraint mechanism must be secured snugly against the rider's body.

On Banshee, Mystic Timbers and Orion, loose items that are not able to be stored in cargo pockets are not permitted in line and must be stored in a locker or with a non-rider.

For safety reasons, cell phone usage, taking pictures, and filming on rides are prohibited.

Glasses must be secured on all rides.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water at water rides and attractions. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all rides.

LOST & FOUND

All items found at Kings Island are turned in to our Lost and Found Department located at the Main Gate near the ticket windows. If you lose an item on a ride, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the ride in operation an immediate search may not be possible. Please visit Lost and Found to complete paperwork to ensure the item is returned to you if it's found. For your safety, do not enter restricted areas. **FOR YOUR SAFETY, DO NOT ENTER UNAUTHORIZED AREAS TO RETRIEVE LOST ARTICLES.**

You may be seriously injured if you enter a restricted area.

MAGNETIC FIELDS ON RIDES

Magnetics are used at the following attractions: Backlot Stunt Coaster, Banshee, The Beast, Diamondback, Drop Tower, Flight of Fear, Mystic Timbers and Orion. Guests with medical devices sensitive to magnetic fields (pacemakers, hearing aids, etc.), should consider these factors when deciding to ride.

OXYGEN TANKS

Due to the dynamic nature of rides, Portable Oxygen Tanks are only permitted on the following rides: Boo Blasters on Boo Hill, Grand Carousel, Character Carousel, Eiffel Tower, KI & Miami Valley Railroad, Woodstock Whirlybirds and Snoopy's™ Junction. The tank must fit safely in the ride unit and not interfere with the ride restraint system.

Many rides can accommodate smaller Personal Oxygen Equipment. Personal Oxygen Equipment that can be secured around the waist, or with a strap that can be worn over the shoulder of one arm and under the other arm, may be permitted as long as the contents of the equipment housing can be contained. The equipment must allow the restraint mechanism to be secured snugly against the rider's body. The equipment must not prevent guests from properly sitting in the ride unit with their back and shoulders against the seat back. At no time may the equipment be between the guest and the seat or the restraint. Guests must be free to hold on during the ride; therefore, nothing may be in their hands while riding.

PHOTOSENSITIVITY/STROBE LIGHTING

Many attractions utilize special effects including strobe lighting and specialty ride lights that may impact guests with certain medical conditions. Attractions utilizing these effects include: Banshee, The Beast, Boo Blasters on Boo Hill, Diamondback, Flight of Fear, The Great Pumpkin Coaster, Mystic Timbers, Orion, Race for Your Life Charlie Brown, and Woodstock Express. Strobe lighting is also used during night operation at Eiffel Tower, Scrambler, Shake Rattle & Roll, Slingshot, WindSeeker, and Woodstock Gliders.

PREGNANCY

Guests who are pregnant may only ride Kings Island & Miami Valley Railroad, Eiffel Tower, Grand Carousel, Character Carousel, Boo Blasters on Boo Hill and Woodstock Gliders.

PROPER ATTIRE

Most rides require proper riding attire including shirts, shorts and shoes. Shirts and shoes are required in queues and all park pathways. Swimwear is not permitted on rides outside of Soak City, with the exception of Congo Falls, Race for Your Life Charlie Brown, and White Water Canyon. For your safety, loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be significantly secured or removed to prevent any interference with the ride restraint system. On all rollercoasters and Dodgem scarves will be required to be removed. Loose fitting shoes may be removed before riding Invertigo, Drop Tower, Delirium, Banshee, Zephyr, Flying Ace Aerial Chase and WindSeeker.

Appropriate swimwear is required in Soak City. Thongs or transparent clothing are not permitted.

PROSTHETIC DEVICES

Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. All riders must be able to maintain the proper riding position. Guests with prosthetic limbs should visit Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding to ensure a safe riding experience. Guests with any type of leg prosthesis are not permitted to ride Banshee, Delirium, Diamondback, Invertigo or Orion. Guests with any type of prosthesis are not permitted to ride Flight of Fear.

The manufacturer of Drop Tower requires that guests with prosthetic devices provide Kings Island with documentation from the provider of the prosthetic devices to guarantee that the device has been designed to remain securely in place when exceeding a maximum speed of 120 miles per hour with maximum G forces from -1.5 G's to 5 G's, with sufficient safety factor for a single point failure item.

Guests with prosthetics which do not have metal parts are generally permitted on all Soak City attractions. Please consult with a member of our Aquatics supervisory team prior to riding to ensure that you have a safe riding experience.

RIDE DEVICES FOR GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES

Transfer devices, when requested, can be used to assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into a ride unit. The following rides are equipped with a transfer device: Banshee, Beast, Racer, Mystic Timbers, The Bat, and Woodstock Express.

Body Harnesses, when requested, allow certain riders with disabilities the ability to ride if they meet the ride criteria. The following rides are equipped with a body harness: Banshee, Diamondback and Orion. Please see an associate at each ride or Guest Services for assistance.

RIDER CRITERIA

Kings Island's Ride Admission Policy is designed to allow our guests to participate in the enjoyment of our parks as much as possible. The policy was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely ride each particular ride. It is our policy to allow anyone to ride who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to himself or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Ride Admission Policy as necessary.

The evaluation of each ride considered the following criteria which may be required to ride a particular ride safely.

Ability to exhibit independent seated postural control under the dynamic conditions of the ride.

The guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people and devices. The guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as carousel horses require the ability to form a saddle posture with the guest's thighs.

Required for ALL rides and attractions with the exception of the Eiffel Tower. Guests may ride the following rides while being accompanied by a supervising companion: Boo Blasters on Boo Hill, Grand Carousel (in a chariot), Character Carousel (in a chariot) K.I. & Miami Valley Railroad (in the center of the bench), Woodstock Whirlybirds, Kings Mills Antique Autos, Aruba Tuba – Pool, Breakers Bay, Castaway Cove – Pool, Coconut Cove, Lookout Lagoon – Pool, Splash Landing– Structure, Splash River and Tidal Wave Bay.

Appropriate center of gravity.

The guest's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.

A functioning arm is an upper extremity or prosthesis exhibiting good grip control, the ability to brace, and enough strength to allow the guest to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms as defined above.

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.

Guests must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg is a lower extremity or prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthetics.

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.

Guests must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. A functioning leg may be a normal leg or a prosthesis which can be used for bracing.

Minimum of two functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of three functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and an arm or two arms and a leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride.

Ability to enter/exit ride within specified parameters without endangering self or others.

Guests must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our associates and guests, ride operators are instructed not to perform any lifting of guests.

Appropriate observed behavior.

Guest demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow rider requirements. Appropriate Observed Behavior may include but not be limited to maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride or safety equipment and a willingness to participate.

Guests have a duty to:

- Exercise good judgement
- Act in a responsible manner while using amusement rides
- Obey all warnings prior to and during participation
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Properly use all ride safety equipment provided

CASTS AND BRACES

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from riding rides where the cast or brace will not fit inside the ride unit or where it will present a hazard to the guest or others. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most rides and water slides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed. Casts and braces with exposed metal parts are not permitted on most slides in Soak City

The following chart displays the cast and brace rules for all rides and attractions.

- Y** May ride with this condition.
- F** Cast/Brace must fit safely inside ride unit
- B** Must be seated with a Supervising Companion in the center of the bench
- O** Not permitted to participate on elevated activity area
- Z** Participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary

ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below:



This symbol is used to identify rides where the guest may remain in wheelchair. These rides include: Eiffel Tower and Kings Island and Miami Valley Railroad.



This symbol identifies rides that can accommodate guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



This symbol identifies rides where guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party. A wheelchair may be left in a designated position on or near the ride platform.

RIDES

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the type of actions caused by various rides. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria itemized above. In order to participate on most attractions, guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the ride safely. Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each ride.

Adventure Express



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high speed wood and steel roller coaster with a combination of banked turns and tunnels.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Backlot Stunt Coaster



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per rider

A steel LIM roller coaster that launches riders up to 40 miles per hour in 4 seconds. Riders will experience high speeds, weightlessness, rapid movements from side-to-side, and a tunnel.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis, additional padding constrains both legs across the ankles. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. To facilitate boarding, a row with a larger opening is available upon request. Please inform an associate if you wish to use that row. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Banshee 5



Guests must be between 52" and 78" tall to ride.

The world's longest inverted roller coaster is a high speed ride that will take riders through seven inversions at speeds up to 68 miles per hour.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to evaluate proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities, including one functioning arm that includes a hand. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Guests with any type of upper extremity prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Leg prosthetics are not permitted. Alternatively, guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the guest has remaining leg and arm remnants to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A wheelchair lift is available in the exit to transport guests to the ride platform. Please use the phone at the bottom of the exit to receive operator assistance.

Note: Loose articles may not be left on the platform. They may either be left with a non-rider or be placed in lockers for storage.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

The Bat 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A suspended steel roller coaster with a combination of high speed banked turns. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg remnants sufficient to brace self upright in the seat against the shoulder harness. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

The Beast 5



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high speed wooden roller coaster with a combination of banked turns and tunnels.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting. This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Boo Blasters on Boo Hill 2



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. Service animals are welcome.

A family themed interactive dark ride. Riders will enter a moving car that can seat up to five total guests (no more than 3 adults per car). They will use a special weapon called a Boo Blaster to zap Boocifer and several other skeletons and ghosts to accumulate points.

Restraint System: A door closes on the ride unit to secure all riders.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have seated postural control, the ability to enter or exit the ride safely, or cannot demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps along a moving turntable, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the door of the unit for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

WARNING: Attraction is designed to scare or startle.

Character Carousel 1



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants are permitted in chariot seating. Guests over 60" tall must be accompanied by a child and are not permitted to ride on a jumper horse. Service animals are welcome.

A classic carousel with both stationary and jumper horses, as well as two chariots.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm. Guests must have the ability to straddle the ride unit. Guests unable to straddle the ride unit or do not have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm must be seated in a chariot unit. Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, an appropriate center of gravity, or appropriate observed behavior must ride in a chariot with a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit.

Charlie Brown's Wind Up 1



Guests must be between 36" and 54" tall to ride.

A child-size chair swing with free hanging seats suspended from a gently rotating tower.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Congo Falls 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride.

This is a water flume ride with boats that rock side-to-side and plunge down a chute into a splash of water. You will get wet.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

Delirium 5



Guests must be between 52" and 76" tall to ride.

A thrill ride that swings in a pendulum motion while spinning. Riders will experience weightlessness, strong side-to-side movement, and rapidly changing forces and directions.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to evaluate proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with cervical collar neck brace or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any type of arm prosthetic should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Leg prosthetics are not permitted on this ride. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride without the prosthetic.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Diamondback 5



Guests must be 54" tall to ride.

A high speed steel roller coaster with a combination of banked turns and airtime hills.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to evaluate proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities, including one functioning arm that includes a hand. Due to manufacturer requirements, a prosthetic leg is not a substitute for a leg amputation. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and the lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the ankle. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any type of arm prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Leg and/or foot prosthetics are not permitted on this ride. Alternatively, guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the guest has remaining leg and arm remnants to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Dodgem 4



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A bumper car ride where guests drive cars one way around a circular track. Riders will experience strong side-to-side movement and rapidly changing direction and forces.

Restraint System: An individual shoulder strap is positioned across the chest and under the arm of each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities to drive. Passengers must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with a visual impairment must ride as a passenger with a driver who meets the requirements to drive.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available via the lane to the right of the entrance. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Note: Avoid head-on collisions.

Drop Tower 4



Guests must be between 48" and 80" tall to ride.

A free-fall ride that lifts riders to the top of a structure and drops them. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapidly changing forces.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains him/her and a minimum of two functioning extremities with one functioning arm. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any prosthesis must consult with Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to go up several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride utilizes magnetic systems during the ride.

Eiffel Tower 2



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. Service animals are welcome.

One-third scale replica of the Eiffel Tower located in Paris. Standing 314 feet tall, this observation tower provides stunning views of the park and surrounding areas.

Rider Criteria: Guests who are unable to enter and exit safely or demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. This attraction is wheelchair accessible.

WARNING: During night operation this ride contains strobe lighting.

Flight of Fear 5



Guests must be 54" tall to ride.

An indoor steel roller coaster that launches riders up to 54 miles per hour and turns riders upside down 4 times. Riders will experience high speeds, weightlessness, and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis, additional padding constrains both legs across the ankles. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Joe Cool's Dodgem School 2



Guests must be less than 54" tall to ride. No hand-held infants.

A children's bumper car ride. Riders will experience strong side-to-side movement and rapidly changing direction and forces.

Restraint System: An individual shoulder strap is positioned across the chest and under the arm of each rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available via the lane to the right of the ride, near Charlie Brown's Windup. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Kings Island and Miami Valley Railroad 1



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. Service animals are welcome.

Authentic steam powered engines take passengers around a track that makes stops in Rivertown and Soak City. Guests are seated on a bench. Guests under 46" must sit in the center of the bench, not on the outside edge.

Rider Criteria: Guests without the ability to exhibit independent seated postural control under the dynamic conditions of the ride and demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion and seated in the center of the bench.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available via the exit. Wheelchairs can be folded and loaded on the train. This ride is also wheelchair accessible via a ramp used to board the train.

Kings Mills Antique Autos 2



Guests must be a minimum of 48" tall to ride alone OR be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This is an antique styled gas-powered car that is driven by the rider on a designated track for up to four riders per car.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests who do not meet this criteria or guests unable to maintain seated postural control must ride with a supervising companion in the back seat if they have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains him/her. Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion.

This is a family tower ride where riders are propelled to the top and bounce down to the platform. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapidly changing forces and directions.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Lower extremities must be sufficient to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains him/her. Linus' Beetle Bugs 2



Guests must be between 36" and 54" tall to ride

This is a children's ride where guests are seated in cars that follow an oblong track and whip quickly around the corners.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures all riders across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Linus Launcher 3



Guests must be 42" tall to ride. Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion.

Maximum Weight – 275 lb. per unit

A circular ride where riders experience the sensation of flying in an elevated, slanted and prone position. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: A cage secures riders across the back, shoulders and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Guests must be 46" to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. No hand-held infants.

Maximum Weight – 400 lb. per car

A circular ride with pods that spin on arms that move in a clockwise motion while also moving up and down.

Restraint Type: An enclosed ride unit encapsulates the ride unit to secure the riders. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (excluding prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a rider out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. A wheelchair lift is available in the exit to transport guests to the ride platform. Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size. A test seat is located at the ride entrance which can be used to evaluate proper fit and comfort prior to waiting in line.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities including one functioning arm that includes a hand. Due to manufacturer requirements, a prosthetic leg is not a substitute for a leg amputation. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and the lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be below the ankle. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Guests with any type of upper extremity prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Leg and/or foot prosthetics are not permitted on this ride. Guests must be less than 54" tall to ride. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This is a slow moving circular children's ride.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains him/her and a minimum of two functioning extremities with one functioning arm. Two functioning legs are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

Race For Your Life Charlie Brown 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion.

This is a water flume ride; riders will get wet! Guests will be seated in a rocking boat and brace for a plunge down a chute, and a splash of water.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest is able to form a straddle posture with leg remnants sufficient to brace self-upright in the seat. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting and may be slippery and wet. Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

A high speed wooden roller coaster with airtime hills.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities: one functioning arm (excluding prosthesis) and one functioning leg. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Scrambler 3



Guests must be 48" tall to ride alone OR 36" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion.

Maximum Weight – 510 lb. per car

Rotating cars are mounted on counter-rotating arms, which produces strong accelerations and side-to-side movement, changing force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests may have two functioning legs instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Guests must be 54" tall to ride alone OR 42" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion

A circular ride with three arms of gondolas moving counterclockwise against the ride's main clockwise direction. Riders will experience weightlessness, strong accelerations, and side-to-side movement.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all riders in the row. An individual seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains him/her. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

Guests must be 40" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted. Guests over 60" tall must be accompanied by a child.

This is a slow moving miniature train ride.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Arm casts must not be positioned next to another rider.

Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps along a moving turntable, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Guests must be 52" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 304 lb. per car

A chair swing ride with hanging seats suspended from an elevated and rotating tower.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and a between-the-leg safety belt secures each rider. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (excluding prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any prosthesis must consult with Guest Services prior to waiting in line or riding.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

WARNING: During night operation this ride contains strobe lighting.

Woodstock Express 4



Guests must be 46" tall to ride alone OR 40" tall and accompanied by a supervising companion.

A junior wooden rollercoaster with banked curves and airtime hills.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all riders in the row. An individual seatbelt secures each rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures each set of riders, fastening across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (including prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride. Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

WARNING: During night operation this ride contains strobe lighting.

Woodstock Whirlybirds 2



Guests must be 42" tall to ride alone OR accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight – 440 lb. per car

This is an elevated slow moving helicopter ride.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning leg. Guests must also have the ability to maintain seated postural control and demonstrate appropriate observed behavior. Guests who do not meet these requirements must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Xtreme Skyflyer



Guests must be 42" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 850 lb. per flight

A high-thrill Skycoaster attraction made to simulate flight. Riders are hoisted 150 feet into the air. They control their own ride experience by pulling the ripcord, initiating their tethered freefall descent and flight. The sensation of flight as riders fall is similar to skydiving and hang gliding, with riders reaching speeds up to 60 miles per hour.

Restraint System: Riders wear a full body harness that supports the rider in a prone position. The harness is connected to the flight support cables.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to have a minimum of one functioning leg and by reason of the restraint system inherent in the flight suit, it is necessary that the rider possesses two arms sufficient for proper functioning of the flight suit be maintained. Lower extremities must be of sufficient enough length to be contained and restrained by a leg strap. Proper Functioning of the flight suit must be maintained for riders without appropriate center of gravity. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access available via the entrance. Riders must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

Note: This is an extra charge attraction.

Zephyr



Guests must be 48" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 230 lb. per rider

A chair swing family ride with free hanging seats suspended from an elevated, rotating, and slanting tower. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and a between-the-leg safety belt secures each rider. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

SOAK CITY WATERPARK

Each attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides	 This is a low speed, and or shallow water attraction.
Mild Thrill Rides	 This is a low to medium speed attraction, and/or water depth to 48 inches. Some rider control, maneuvering and/or swimming skills required.
Moderate Thrill Rides	 This is a medium speed attraction. Height and water depth may vary Moderate or unexpected forces can be generated during the ride. This attraction may require rider control and/or strong swimming skills. Physical activity may be strenuous.
High Thrill Rides	 This is a fast paced ride experience. Riders will encounter changes in speed, direction, elevation, strong water currents, and/or depth of water, some of which is unexpected. This attraction requires rider body control and strong swimming skills.
Aggressive Thrill Rides	 This is a high speed and/or deep water attraction with turbulent turns, drops and/or strong water currents with changes in speed, direction, elevation and/or deep water, which may be unexpected. This attraction requires rider body control and swimming skills.



Appropriate Attire

Appropriate swimwear is required. Thongs or transparent clothing are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swimwear. There can be no sharp objects, such as metal prosthesis, on the slides. Hearing devices or other electronic devices may be damaged by water. Please take the necessary steps to protect such items. Guests with glasses should wear a safety strap on the slides. Contact lenses are not recommended.

Guests requiring special accommodation should speak to a member of the Aquatics management team. Specifically designed attire made out of lycra or nylon type materials will be considered. Due to attraction manufacturer requirements, some riding restrictions may apply.



Life Jackets

Life jackets are required for children who are less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Life jackets are available for all guests needing special consideration. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by a supervising companion. These policies will be enforced in the following locations: Breaker's Bay, Tidal Wave Bay and Splash River.

Only Coast Guard approved life jackets are allowed as flotation devices. Life jackets are provided free of charge for guests who require one.



Ongoing Lifeguard Training

In an ongoing effort to provide a safe and enjoyable waterpark experience for our guests, Kings Island routinely utilizes training exercises to improve our lifeguards' skills and vigilance. These exercises will occur during normal operating hours and may consist of the following: submersible water mannequins; the use of video surveillance equipment; internal and external audits, and active/inactive water rescues and/or first aid scenarios.



Scales

Red light/green light scale systems are used at weight sensitive attractions. Guests who exceed the weight requirement will not be permitted to ride. Scales are used at Mondo Monsoon.



Swim Diapers

Guests who require a diaper are required to wear swim diapers or a diaper specifically designed for aquatic use.



Water Wheelchairs and Pool Lifts

A water wheelchair is available for guests requiring additional assistance when at Coconut Cove, Splash River (Entry Area), Tidal Wave Bay, and Breakers Bay. The water wheelchair may be used by multiple guests on the same day. While in a wave pool, the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. During your visit, please speak to a member of our Aquatics Supervisory team to obtain access to the water wheelchair and for further accessibility information.

Castaway Cove – Pool 1



Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests over 52" tall in bare feet must be accompanied by a child.

Shallow pool with water depths ranging from zero to 18".

Rider Criteria: Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair.

Castaway Cove – Slide 1



Children must be less than 52" tall in bare feet to ride.

A small children's slide that empties into 18" of water.

Rider Criteria: Guests must lay feet first with their arms across their chest, legs crossed at the ankles, and back flat against the slide. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities. Hand-held infants are not permitted to ride. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing a few steps. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Coconut Cove 1



Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Wading pool up to 36" deep with seating area and waterfall.

Rider Criteria: Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior; exhibit seated postural control or be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. A water wheelchair is available for participants requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics supervisor team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Lookout Lagoon – Pool 1



Guests over 52" tall in bare feet must be accompanied by a child. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Wading pool with water depths ranging from zero to 18".

Rider Criteria: Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair.

Lookout Lagoon – Child Body Slides 1



Guests must be less than 52" tall in bare feet to ride.

Small children's slides that empty into 18" of water.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have one sufficient upper extremity to maintain the proper riding position and the ability to brace self with one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride. Hand-held infants are not permitted to ride. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior. Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — slide on your back, feet first, arms crossed over your chest, legs straight, and ankles crossed.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing a few steps. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Mondo Monsoon 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight — 700 lb. per tube

Cloverleaf tubes take guests twisting and turning into complete darkness before dropping 60 feet into an open funnel. The tube will slide back and forth in the funnel before landing in an 18" catch pool.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be seated in the tube with feet in the middle, facing forward, sitting up straight, and holding onto both handles. Guests must hold handles throughout the entire ride. Minimum two riders; maximum four riders. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, full leg cast, or lower leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Note: A red light/green light scale is used at this attraction. Guests who exceed the weight requirements will not be permitted to ride.

Paradise Plunge 4



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Four open single rider body slides with banked turns and drops. Slides end in a 42" deep catch pool.

Rider Criteria: Guests must lay feet first with their arms across their chest, legs crossed at the ankles, and back flat against the slide. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: T-shirts and other loose-fitting clothing are not permitted

Pineapple Pipeline 3



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Three fully enclosed translucent body slides. Two slides turn 360 degrees; the middle slide features a vertical drop. Slides end in a 12" deep run out.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — slide on your back, feet first, arms crossed over your chest, legs straight, and ankles crossed. Guests must have four functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: T-shirts and other loose-fitting clothing are not permitted

Pipeline Paradise 5



Guests must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride.

A wave machine allows guests to surf either a straight or curved wave on a body board.

Rider Criteria: Guests must lie down headfirst, on stomach with torso in contact with the board, OR with at least one knee in contact with the board. Guests must have the ability to hold on with two functioning arms. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collar bone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride

Rider Access: Access to each section of the attraction requires guests to step up to the entrance flume area and enter head first on the board. Riders will have to transfer to a board, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: T-shirts and other loose-fitting clothing are not permitted

Rendezvous Run 4



Guests must be 40" tall in bare feet to ride.

Guests slide head first on a mat down four partially enclosed mat racing flumes. Slides turn 360 degrees before descending into a 12" deep runout.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — lie down head first, on stomach and hold handles. Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have the ability to hold on with two functioning arms and brace self with one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a mat. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the mat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Splash Landing – Play Structure 2



Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Interactive water play structure with various play elements including a giant tipping bucket.

Rider Criteria: Guests who cannot maintain seated postural control must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the play structure and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Splash Landing – Slides 2



Guests must be 36" tall in bare feet to ride.

Interactive water play structure with various play elements including a giant tipping bucket and three slides.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have one sufficient upper extremity to maintain the proper riding position, the ability to brace self with two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride. Hand-held infants are not permitted to ride. Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — slide on your back, feet first, arms crossed over your chest, legs straight, and ankles crossed. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the play structure and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Splash River 2



Children must be 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone OR be accompanied by a supervising companion. Children under 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A supervising companion may accompany up to 2 children.

A slow moving, winding river tube ride at a depth of 30" with various interactive elements.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held Infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. Riders will have to transfer to a tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Thunder Falls 3



Guests must be 40" tall in bare feet. Guests less than 48" tall must wear a life jacket.

Individual tube ride with banked turns and drops ends in a 42" deep catch pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — sit facing forward and hold handle(s) in front of you. Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm, brace self with one functioning leg and have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Tidal Wave Bay 4



Children less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. Children less than 42" tall in bare feet must wear a life jacket and be accompanied by a supervising companion. A supervising companion may accompany up to 2 guests.

A large wave pool with depths ranging from 0 ft. (0 cm) to 6 ft. (183 cm). Waves are generated for 5 minutes on, and then 5 minutes off. During wave action, strenuous activity is required. Prolonged exposure to wave action may result in fatigue. Exercise caution in deep water

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Hand-held infants participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary and must be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests with a full arm cast or full leg cast are welcome to enjoy the attraction, but participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone or braced arm cast cannot participate.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair. A water wheelchair is available for guests requiring additional assistance. Please speak to a member of our Aquatics supervisor team to obtain access to the water wheelchair.

Tropical Twister 4



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Two fully enclosed translucent body slides. Slides intertwine and end in a 12" deep runout.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — slide on your back, feet first, hand behind your head and legs straight. Guests must have four functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: T-shirts and other loose-fitting clothing are not permitted

Tropical Plunge – Body Slides 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per person

Riders step into one of three chambers. The floor will drop underneath their feet, sending them on a high-speed, almost vertical free fall through a series of s-curves. Slides end in a 10" deep runout. Maximum water depth is 10".

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to maintain the proper riding position — arms crossed over their chest, legs crossed at the ankles, and head and back flat against the slide. Guests must have four functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Note: Loose articles are not permitted, including, but not limited to: piercings, necklaces, rings and t-shirts.

Tropical Plunge – Tube Slides 1 & 2 5



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per person

A pair of 337 feet long inner tube water slides at the Tropical Plunge tower that sends guests through a variety of twists, turns, and drops going in and out of darkness before a high speed drop ending in a 42" deep pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position— seated in the tube, facing forward, and holding onto the handles. Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm, brace self with one functioning leg and have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Tropical Plunge – Tube Slide 3



Guests must be 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 300 lb. per person

An enclosed inner tube water slide at the Tropical Plunge tower that sends guests through a series of twists, turns, and four 360-degree spirals across a 449 foot slide ending in a 42" deep pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position — seated in the tube, facing forward, and holding onto the handles. Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm, brace self with one functioning leg and have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Zoom Flume



Guests must be 40" tall in bare feet to ride. Children less than 42" tall in bare feet must wear a life jacket. Children less than 48" tall in bare feet must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

Maximum Weight – 1,200 lb. per tube

Two to four person family raft ride with banked turns and drops. Slide ends in 24" deep catch pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders are required to maintain the proper riding position throughout the entire ride — seated with back against the raft and hold onto handles. Guests must have the ability to exhibit seated postural control and have appropriate center of gravity. Guests must have the ability to hold on with one functioning arm, brace self with one functioning leg and have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, full leg cast, or lower leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

ENTERTAINMENT VENUES

Due to the popularity of our shows, we suggest you arrive early as seating may be limited. Show schedules are available at Guest Services, on the Kings Island mobile app and at any theatre entrance. All Entertainment venues are accessible to guests who may have a mobility impairment. Assisted listening devices are available for guests at each theater, who are hearing impaired. Large print scripts may also be available. Ask any associate at the venue for assistance.

Assisted Listening Devices are available at Kings Island Theater. Stroller parking is located outside the theater. Please see Theater Attendants for additional assistance.

Peanuts Showplace

Peanuts Showplace is a large indoor theater equipped with air conditioning. Viewing areas that can accommodate guests in wheelchairs are available. Assisted Listening Devices are available at Peanuts Showplace. Stroller parking is located outside the theater. Please see Theater Attendants for additional assistance.

The Festhaus

The Festhaus is a large indoor theater equipped with air conditioning. Viewing areas that can accommodate guests in wheelchairs are available. Assisted Listening Devices are available at the Festhaus. Strollers are allowed inside this facility. Please see Theater Attendants for additional assistance.

Outdoor Theaters

The International Showplace & Peanuts Playhouse

The International Showplace and Peanuts Playhouse are outdoor stages with bench seating. Stroller parking is located outside of the theater only. Please see a Theater/Venue Host for additional assistance. Assisted Listening Devices are available at International Showplace.

The Bandstand

The Bandstand is an outdoor stage with viewing areas. Please see a Theater/Venue Host for additional assistance. Assisted Listening Devices are available at Bandstand.

HALLOWEEN HAUNT

Kings Island Halloween Haunt has extreme haunts that are designed to scare and startle. These attractions and the park general will have areas of low lighting, loud sounds and dense fog. Please adhere to all posted and verbal warnings and directions. Some attractions may require guests to transfer from their motorized wheelchairs to a non-motorized wheelchair located at the attraction. Strobe lighting may be in effect at some attractions, theme buildings, and Scare Zones. Guests with respiratory sensitivities, history of seizures or epilepsy, or sensitivities to loud music and sound effects are advised not to participate in these attractions.

Characters inside our Haunt Attractions will not touch you; please do not touch them in any manner. Those that do so will be removed from the park without refund. Rowdy behavior and profanity are also cause for removal from the park. For safety reasons, guests may not wear their own face paint, costumes or masks. See park map and guide or Guest Services for dates.

WINTERFEST

Kings Island's WinterFest Event is filled with delightful holiday cheer for guests of all ages. Many areas of the park will have low lighting, fog, snow machines and strobe styled lighting. Guests with a history of seizures or epilepsy should be aware of flashing and strobe styled lighting that will be present throughout the park. Please see a Guest Services representative for any additional questions.

Snowflake Lake



Guests 10 years of age or younger must be accompanied by a supervising companion on the ice at all times.

This traditional styled ice skating rink allows participants to skate in a counter-clockwise direction around the ice rink. Ice skates are required for all participants to be on the ice. Speed skating, roughness, excessive speeding or weaving through other skaters is prohibited.

Rider Criteria: Guests with cervical collar or neck braces, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to participate in this attraction. Guest must have appropriate observed behavior to participate.

Rider Access: Alternate Access via the Entrance to the attraction. Guests must be able to take several steps and step on to the ice on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Guests in wheelchairs can transfer and participate with the use of a chair designed to be on the ice. Please see ice rink associates for details. Wheelchair parking is located around the ice.

Guests must be 42" tall to ride.

This is an 18' high tubing hill.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities, including two arms. Cervical collar or neck brace, broken collar bone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access via the pathway to the left of the hill. Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.
